

• Deal # 1 - Meidu Holding Acquires Woodbine Acquisition



Deal Terms

- o \$535 MM acquisition of the equity of Woodbine Acquisition LLC
 - \$260 MM in cash
 - \$275 MM of debt left at the company
 - Additional consideration paid for net working capital at the company
- o Certain assets were excluded at the time of closing
- o Deal closed December 3, 2013

- Woodbine Acquisition Assets
 - o Approximately 17,500 gross acres
 - o Approximately 15,000 net acres
 - o Kurten and Madisonville West Fields in southeast Texas
 - o Focused on Woodbine formation
 - o Horizontal drilling

- Deal topics/hurdles
 - o Asset v. equity
 - o Escrow deposit
 - o Governmental approvals
 - o Debt holder approvals

 Deal # 2 - MD America Energy, LLC Issues \$150MM High Yield PIK Toggle Notes

- o \$150 MM PIK Toggle Notes
- o Secured by equity of MD America Energy Holdings, LLC who issued the notes (also called bonds)
- o Acquisition financing for Meidu Holding
- o High yield interest rate
- o Maturity date in two years

- Deal Terms
 - o \$150 MM PIK Toggle Notes
 - What is PIK?
 - PIK stands for "payment in kind"
 - "Payment in kind" is really a confusing term because implies the debt holders receive something
 - In this case, the debt holders receive the right to more money that the issuer of the debt has to pay as opposed to an actual interest payment

- Deal Terms
 - o \$150 MM PIK Toggle Notes
 - What is a Toggle Note?
 - Toggle means that the issuer of the debt (think of them as the borrower) can choose to either:
 - (a) pay cash or
 - (b) choose to PIK the interest payment

- Deal Terms
 - o \$150 MM PIK Toggle Notes
 - Why a Toggle Note?
 - Issuers (borrowers) love the flexibility to choose what to pay each interest period
 - Great for oil and gas deals in development stage
 - Less drilling, toggle to cash payments
 - More drilling, toggle to PIK

- Deal Terms
 - o \$150 MM PIK Toggle Notes
 - Feature of Toggle Note
 - If PIK, interest is higher
 - If cash, interest rate is lower
 - Example: \$100 note issued with interest paid annually
 - If PIK, then 20% interest, \$120 owed
 - If cash, then 10% \$10 paid, \$100 owed







 - o Acquisition financing for Meidu Holding
 - Why do this \$150MM debt offering?
 - Two things:
 - > Belief in the project
 - Much shorter approval time to bring over less than \$150 MM from China

- Deal Terms
 - High yield interest rate
 - Why is the interest rate high?
 - Debt below this debt
 - Restricted payments coming from the entity with revenue
 - 2nd position in assets
 - Example: Your 2nd mortgage on your home has a higher interest rate than 1st mortgage
 - Picture worth a thousand words

Deal # 3- Cubic Energy Issues \$66 MM of Debt with Equity Kickers



- Cubic Energy Issues \$66 MM of Debt with Equity Kickers
 - o Cubic is an OTCQB traded company (OTCQB: CBNR)
 - What is OTCQB?
 - A group of over the counter stocks that are required to report to the SEC
 - Traded over the OTC Market Group interface
 - o Cubic's assets are located in Leon and Robertson County, Texas and Northwest

Louisiana
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Deal Terms

- o Relatively high interest rate
- o 3 year maturity date
- o Partial PIK interest payments for first 6 months
- o Two classes of warrants to lenders
- o Lenders have first lien on Texas assets; second lien on Louisiana assets

- Deal Terms
 - Relatively high interest rate
 - Why?
 - Other debt involved
 - Need some drilling \$\$\$

- Deal Terms
 - o Two classes of warrants to lenders
 - What is a warrant?
 - Option to purchase equity in the ownership
 - One class works like a preferred share and one class works like a non-preferred share

 Deal # 4- Cubic Energy Issues Call Options for \$35MM



Deal Terms

- o Cubic receives \$35 MM
- o Cubic sells future production for \$X price
- Option provider receives right to buy production at \$X price and hopes to sell at a higher price

- Deal # 5 Energy Services
 - o Private energy services entrepreneur buys three private, family-owned service businesses operating in Oklahoma in last four months of 2013
 - Trucking company
 - Equipment rental company
 - Construction services
 - o Total purchase price: ~\$25 MM


- Deal # 5 Energy Services
 - o Deal Terms
 - Significant owner financing
 - Significant owner employment agreements
 - Earn-outs or other business performance bumps
 - Pledge of equity of company to seller

- Deal # 5 Energy Services
 - o Advantages
 - Low cash outlay
 - Better refinancing possible with better lender network
 - Scale and integration

- Deal # 5 Energy Services
 - o Disadvantages
 - Seller loses edge that he or she built the business on the job and business starts declining
 - Built around small pool of material customers

- TSX and AIM Markets
 - o TSX = Toronto Stock Exchange
 - o AIM Alternative Investment Market
 - The little brother to the Main Street Market in London
 - o Both are active for US deals and especially deals involving assets in non-US jurisdictions
 - o Less regulations easier to manage
 - o Smaller deals
